

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON HOUSEHOLD FINANCE

19 – 20 September 2023
Frankfurt am Main, Germany

The Research Centre of the Deutsche Bundesbank organizes the International Conference on Household Finance with the objective to present state-of-the-art research in the field.

In particular, we are interested in papers on households' consumption, saving, housing decisions, investment and borrowing decisions, households' reaction to uncertainty, expectation formation and disagreements about inflation, house price developments and labor income risks. Further topics include the effects of monetary and fiscal policies on household behavior, attitudes towards taxation, redistribution and climate change and their reflection into household behavior. The focus will be on research that makes use of household- and person-level data, such as consumption and wealth surveys as well as large-scale online surveys.

We solicit papers in the following areas, but related areas may also be considered:

- Household saving, consumption and liquidity constraints
- Homeownership decisions and mortgages
- Behavioral aspects of household finance: expectations, preferences and attitudes
- Asset allocation over the life-cycle
- Financial literacy, cognitive abilities and financial decisions
- Intra/inter-generational distribution of income and wealth
- Effects of natural resource prices on households' decisions
- Distributional consequences of monetary and fiscal policies

Keynote Speakers: Nicola Fuchs-Schündeln (Goethe University Frankfurt) and Atif Mian (Princeton University) will give plenary lectures.

Venue: The conference will take place at the Haus am Dom in Frankfurt am Main, located in the centre of Frankfurt.

Submission of Papers and Expenses: Please create an account and submit completed papers at <https://www.conftool.pro/phf-2023/>. The deadline for submissions is **26 May 2023**. Authors of accepted papers will be notified in **June 2023**. The Bundesbank will cover travel expenses for train tickets within Germany and Europe, economy flights for international presenters and discussants, as well as accommodation. Participants from National Central Banks and EU institutions are expected to cover their own travel expenses.
